Facts

- Children of all ages come into foster care, through *no fault* of their own. More than 80 percent of the children have come into foster care because they have experienced neglect in their home. Some children, whose mothers used drugs or alcohol during pregnancy, may come into care immediately upon birth. Others may come into care as older children. There are also teens in foster care who are in need of loving homes.
- Currently there are more than 19,000 children in out of home care in Arizona, but there are only around 4,500 licensed foster families.
- Foster care is intended to be *temporary*. The goal of the Arizona Department of Child Safety (ADCS) is for the children to go home as soon as their parents fix the situation that made it unsafe for the children to be in their homes. Sometimes the children are able to return home, or *reunify*, very quickly. The goal of more than half of the children in care is to either reunify with their parents or live with other relatives. Other times, particularly when substance abuse is involved, it may take parents longer to remedy the situation. These children may be in foster care for months. **Currently it is estimated that for more than 70 percent of the children coming into care, their parent's drug use is a factor.**
- Sometimes children's parents are unable to provide a safe environment so an adoptive family will be found for the children. If there are relatives who are able to safely care for the children, they will likely be the first choice to adopt the children. The next likely priority is given to the children's current foster parents.
- All children should have a family of their own who will care for them, love them and protect them.

Discussion questions for your family

- What does the word "family" mean to you? Who are the members that make up your family and what is the role they play in your life?
- Joseph was told by an angel in a dream that he would become the foster father of Mary's son and that he was to name him "Jesus" (Matthew 1:20-25). Discuss the importance of listening and discerning God's will in your life and family.
- How would it feel to spend Christmas without your family? What prayers can you offer up for children who won't be able to see their birth family this Christmas?
- List the "gifts" (non-material) you are grateful to have received from your family. What are the gifts that you bring to your family as a son/daughter, brother/sister?


